Community Chest Disbursed \$69m to Support Individuals and Families in Need, and Boost Capacity of Social Service Agencies

 Community Chest Awards recognised 206 corporate partners and donors for their contributions

SINGAPORE, 7 OCTOBER 2024 – Community Chest, the philanthropy arm of the National Council of Social Service (NCSS) disbursed over S\$69 million to 288 programmes, including capability building efforts and ground-up partnerships that improve social services for communities in need in Financial Year (FY) 2023. This was announced at the Community Chest Awards today.

- 2 Corporate partners, individual and public donors answered the call for donations through a variety of national and private fundraising events, a testament to the generous and caring spirit of communities in Singapore.
- In FY2023, Community Chest disbursed about \$34 million to social service programmes, benefitting over 82,000 service users. These include children with special needs and youths at risk, adults with disabilities, persons with mental health conditions, and families and seniors in need.
- One of the service users is Md Ilhan Bin Md Hidayah, 18, who discovered a new path for himself through the YMCA Vocational and Soft Skills programme, which instills resilience among youths at risk. Ilhan initially struggled in school and was facing expulsion. Through this programme, he developed interest and skills as a barista, learnt to better resolve conflicts and went on a journey of self-discovery. Ilhan is now a full-time barista and an aspiring cafe owner.
- Beyond social service programmes, Community Chest also channelled over \$35 million to community projects, capability building efforts and ground-up initiatives. These include Community Capability Trust for SSAs to develop their organisational capabilities, and 4ST Partnership Fund that supports partnership projects between organisations to develop innovative solutions for service users.

- At the Community Chest Awards, 206 corporate partners and individual donors were recognised for their outstanding contributions to the social service sector. They received the awards from Guest of Honour President Tharman Shanmugaratnam; Minister for Social and Family Development and Second Minister for Health, Mr. Masagos Zulkifli; and Minister for National Development and the Minister-in-Charge of
- "Sustained support from our partners, such as through multi-year giving enable Community Chest to continuously put resources to the greatest needs in the social service sector. Their support not only uplift the lives of 82,000 service users, but also enable community agencies to grow stronger and deliver better social services to communities in need. Companies with such culture in sustainable philanthropy through giving, volunteerism or inclusive practices, will reap positive benefits for their employees and business from these meaningful experiences," said Community Chest Chairman Chew Sutat.
- Amongst the awardees, Singtel, SP Group, and UOB received the highest accolade the 'Pinnacle Award', for their exemplary efforts in sustainable philanthropy. They are also the early adopters of the Sustainable Philanthropy Framework, recently launched for businesses to measure and benchmark the outcomes of their philanthropic efforts. Over 40 businesses who participated in the 'Early Adopters Programme' gave feedback that the Framework has helped them to better structure their philanthropic efforts.
- Other award recipients were also recognised for their strong efforts in sustainable giving through SHARE, Community Chest's regular giving programme; Change for Charity initiative, where businesses incorporate a giving mechanism into their business model; as well as regular volunteering efforts with demonstrated outcomes that benefit service users.

SHARE Award	Under SHARE (Social Help and Assistance Raised by Employees), employees of participating organisations provide monthly giving through their payroll to support a wide range of social service agencies. The SHARE Awards recognise organisations with employees on SHARE for their high participation rate. The organisation must have made a minimum annual contribution of \$5,000 and has contributed regularly for at least nine months within the assessment period, but not necessarily for consecutive months.
	There are five types of SHARE Award categorised by the corporates' participation rate on SHARE: • SHARE Achiever: 98% - 100% • SHARE Platinum: 90% - 97% • SHARE Gold: 80% - 89% • SHARE Silver: 70% - 79% • SHARE Bronze: 50% - 69%
Charity Award	The Charity Awards are presented to organisations and individuals who have made significant donations to Community Chest. These donations include outright donations, funds raised from events and contributions through SHARE, Community Chest's monthly giving programme.
